Happy Birthday to Quilter's Bee!

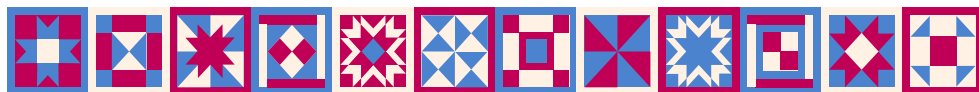

SAMPLE SALE

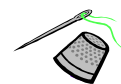
Our sample sale is still ongoing. If you are interested in buying previous sample quilts, ask to see those that are left.

Block of the Month

Have you seen our new Block of the Month for this year? Or maybe I should say our Blocks of the Month, since there are two colorways. Actually, the blocks and the sashings are the same in both quilts. It's just that the setting triangles and borders are different. Either way, both are beautiful. As always, the sign-up fee is \$15.00, which gives you the first block. After that, each month that you come on the third Thursday with the block finished, the next kit is free. If you don't get the block finished, or if you can't come to one of the sessions, you pay \$5.00. And remember: you have to come yourself—no husbands, children, friends, enemies, or helpful animals.

Party with Patrick

Wall hangings, pillows, tablemats, all sorts of small projects are coming from the participants in the Party with Patrick Club these days—all very cute. If you'd like to be part of the group, there are still places available. The group meets the 4th Thursday of the month from 5:30 to 8. You'll need to talk to Ellen and get all the details. And remember that, while you're welcome to share the recipes, the patterns are only available to members.

Knotty Stitchers

Are you up by 9:30 on Saturday mornings? If so, you ought to join the crew at Rise 'n Shine. They meet on the second Saturday and have a good time talking about their projects, their UFOs, and a whole lot of other things. They have Show and Tell and door prizes and interesting conversation and it doesn't cost a thing. Get up and come.

Thimblebees

We're told that hand quilting is getting to be a lost art—but not at Thimblebees. There you can find a group of dedicated hand quilters enjoying something that looks suspiciously like an old-fashioned quilting bee—sitting around finishing their projects by hand. They meet on the third Wednesday of each month from 10 to 1, and for only \$5.00 a session, you can find nice people, interesting conversation, and great stress relief—not to mention the occasional cookie or fruit. They'd love to have you too.

Miniature Quilt Club

The Miniature Quilt Club is beginning to get ready for their annual window display. It's always wonderful. If you'd be interested in being part of the fun, come on the third Saturday at 9:30 and see what they're up to. The dues are \$25.00 a year, but you're welcome to join any time.

Buck-a-Block

Have you seen the Buck-a-Block quilt hanging on the wall in the back of the store? Isn't it pretty, all green and burgundy? We still have another three months or so to go to finish the blocks, but the finishing kits are starting to roll off the assembly line. Be sure to reserve yours soon.

Scraps 'n More

The Scraps 'n More groups are really making progress on their paper pieced stars. They're all going to be beautiful, although very different. If you're interested, talk to Susan to find out if there are any openings. Check the calendar for days and times.





Seasonal Quilt Club

This group is centered around the wonderful book, *Our Best Seasonal Quilts*, and they'll probably finish them all before they're through. That's all right, though, because they're all very fun quilts. They started with Bee Bop and are going on from there. They meet on the second Monday of each month at 6:00 and the fee is only \$10.00 a session. You'll need to get the book, and it's worth every cent. Choose your favorite and get going.

Christmas Tree Block of the Month

This is going to be the most elaborate and one of the most beautiful tree skirts anywhere when it's done. Each block is different and they're joined in a great braid pattern that's going to be spectacular. Have Susan make you a kit or choose your own fabric. Each block will teach you a new technique. The sign-up fee is \$15.00 and then \$5.00 each month when you display your block and pick up the new one. They meet for just a half-hour or so on the first Thursday of each month at 5:00 and you'll end up with a beautiful tree skirt to enjoy for many years.

The Bargain Basement

We understand that money is tight in this economy, and we're trying to help. We've scheduled a number of classes this quarter that are free or only have a minimum fee. They include basic introduction classes, some of the stashbusters, Finishing School, and others. Watch the class schedule carefully to see what we're doing here at Quilter's Bee to try to help your bottom line.

UFO Signup and Cancellations

Don't forget to sign up for UFO night. It's on the third Friday of each month from 6:00-midnight and for only \$20.00 you get good food, good companionship, and good things done on your own projects. And remember that in January UFO night is the week before Block of the Month. But we're going to ask that if you sign up and can't attend, you cancel at least 24 hours in advance so that we can give someone else a chance to attend. Otherwise, we won't be able to refund your money. Thanks for your cooperation and understanding.



Finishing School

Numbers of you have told us that you keep making the Block of the Month blocks and buying the finishing kits, but never really finishing the quilts. We've decided to try to help, so we're starting a Finishing School. We'll have a session each month when you can come and bring former Block of the Month UFOs and work on them here, where we're available to help. We'll ask you to sign up in advance, and \$5.00 will hold your spot, since we'll have a limit of eight. We'll have some of the sessions in the morning, some in the afternoon, and some in the evening, so that one of those times should fit your schedule. Come in and get those BOMs finished. Whew! What a relief that'll be!

Pillowcase Challenge

Quilter's Bee has signed up to be part of American Patchwork and Quilting's One Million Pillowcase Challenge. They are trying to get a million pillowcases made and donated to charities throughout the country in 2010 and there will be a counter on the American Patchwork and Quilting website so that we can all keep track of how many pillowcases have been donated. We have scheduled one session each month to make pillowcases to be donated to various groups in the metropolitan Phoenix area. We hope you'll come in and help us. You may bring in pillowcases you have made at home or come in and make them here at the shop. We'll provide some of the fabric, but this is also a very good way to use up your own stash. Let's all get behind this effort. The sessions at the store will be on Fri., Jan. 8 from 2:00-5:00, on Tues., Feb. 23, from 6:00-9:00, and on Wed., Mar. 31, from 10:00-1:00.

Special Classes

If we're offering a class that you'd like to take but at a time you can't come, we'll be glad to reschedule that class to a time convenient for you if you can find two more people to sign up. You must have three people and the time must also be convenient for the teacher.





Some of the classes we offer require a book and/or a pattern for participation.

Book Required



Pattern Required

1. Buy your fabric before class so that you have time to wash and press it. (If you buy it at the time you register for class, we'll give you a 10% discount.)
2. It will be helpful in some classes if you can cut the pieces before coming. Check the class requirements.
3. Be sure to bring with you to class: Basic sewing equipment such as pins, scissors, needles, seam rippers; Sewing machine, thread and any needed attachments; Rotary cutter, mat, and rulers; Pencils and notepad; A smile and a friendly attitude.

Class Policies

Payment: Payment, either in person or by phone with an approved credit card, is due at the time of class enrollment. We will hold places in classes only for those who have paid.

Class Discount: If you register for a class at Quilter's Bee, we will give you a 10% discount on the fabrics required for the class. The discount must be taken at the time of purchase. Please remind the person at the register that you are buying fabric for a class.

Class Refund Policy: If you find that you can't attend a class in which you're enrolled, we can give you credit toward another class if you change or cancel at least three days before the class is scheduled. Because of the commitment we must make to our teachers, we cannot give credits after that time. If you find at the last minute that you cannot attend a class, you might invite a friend to come in your place.

Class Cancellations: We will make every attempt to hold the classes as scheduled. However, there may be times when we must cancel a class. We will also cancel the class if only one person registers. (You might ask a friend to take the class with you to avoid this type of cancellation.) If we must cancel a class for any reason, we will give you credit toward another class. Please ask for your credit voucher as soon after the cancelled class as possible.
